## Notes

### I. Before You Read

#### A. Hebrews 11:6

But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

#### B. James 2:19

Thou believest that there is one God; thou doest well: the devils also believe, and tremble.

#### C. Hosea 4:6

My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge: because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me: seeing thou hast forgotten the law of thy God, I will also forget thy children.

#### D. Jeremiah 15:16

Thy words were found, and I did eat them; and thy word was unto me the joy and rejoicing of mine heart: for I am called by thy name, O Lord God of hosts.

*Seek first to be consumed with hunger for the Word  
rather than for instruction on how to read the Word.*

### II. What You Read

A. **John 1:1**

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

B. **John 1:14**

And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us [ . . . ]

C. **2 Timothy 3:16**

All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness.

D. **Matthew 24:35**

Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.

E. **Revelation 19:13**

And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and his name is called The Word of God.

*We must never be lulled into thinking man was the author of the Word.  
We must never forget this logos was breathed straight from  
the mouth of God into the ears of human writers who,  
with quill in hand, transformed that divine breath into ink on paper  
so our finite minds could grasp the breath of God.*

### III. When You Read

A. **Psalm 108:2**

Awake, psaltery and harp: I myself will awake early.

B. **Psalm 143:8**

Cause me to hear thy lovingkindness in the morning; for in thee do I trust: cause me to know the way wherein I should walk; for I lift up my soul unto thee.

C. **Mark 1:35**

And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed.

D. **Isaiah 50:4**

The Lord God hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary: he wakeneth morning by morning, he wakeneth mine ear to hear as the learned.

**E. Psalm 5:3**

My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O LORD; in the morning will I direct my prayer unto thee, and will look up.

**F. Psalm 55:17**

Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud: and he shall hear my voice.

**G. Psalm 88:13**

But unto thee have I cried, O LORD; and in the morning shall my prayer prevent thee.

**H. Psalm 92:1-2**

1 It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High:

2 To shew forth thy lovingkindness in the morning, and thy faithfulness every night.

*Whatever we ingest into our spirits **first** in the day will be the **filter** through which everything else passes.*

## IV. While You Read

**A. John 7:16-17**

16 [ . . . ] My doctrine is not mine, but his that sent me.

17 If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself.

**B. Proverbs 16:3**

Commit thy works unto the LORD, and thy thoughts shall be established.

**C. Mark 4:24**

And he said unto them, Take heed what ye hear: with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you: and unto you that hear shall more be given.

**D. James 1:22**

But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.

**E. 2 Timothy 2:7**

Consider what I say; and the Lord give thee understanding in all things.

*Dear Lord, thank you for this day.  
Thank you for your goodness and kindness toward me.  
As I open the pages of your Word, I ask that you speak to me.  
Open my eyes to see.  
Open my ears to hear.  
Give understanding to my mind.  
Fill my heart with your love and my soul with your peace.  
Reveal to me what you would have me know and understand  
from this Logos—this living Word—this day.  
I will accept, embrace, and obey your Words to me.  
I give you praise and thanksgiving  
for allowing me this intimate communion with you.*

## V. After You Read

### A. hagah (H1897)



To murmur, to mutter, to growl . . . to speak with oneself, murmuring and in a low voice

### B. siyach (H7878)



To speak, to sing, to talk with oneself

### C. Joshua 1:8

This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate [hagah] therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.

### D. Psalm 1:2

But his delight is in the law of the LORD; and in his law doth he meditate [hagah] day and night.

### E. Psalm 35:28


And my tongue shall speak [hagah] of thy righteousness and of thy praise all the day long.

### F. Psalm 63:5-6

5 My soul shall be satisfied as with marrow and fatness; and my mouth shall praise thee with joyful lips:  
6 When I remember thee upon my bed, and meditate [hagah] on thee in the night watches.

### G. Psalm 71:24

My tongue also shall talk [hagah] of thy righteousness all the day long: [ . . . ]





## Notes

- H. **Psalm 55:17**  
Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray [siyach], and cry aloud: and he shall hear my voice.
- I. **Psalm 77:6**  
I call to remembrance my song in the night: I commune [siyach] with mine own heart: and my spirit made diligent search.
- J. **Psalm 119:48**  
My hands also will I lift up unto thy commandments, which I have loved; and I will meditate [siyach] in thy statutes.

*The more frantic your life, the more you must retreat in prayer and meditation upon the logos—the Voice—the Word—God Himself.*

## VI. Challenge!

- A. **Pray the “Nona Freeman Prayer for Night People.”**

- B. **Get up 15 minutes earlier than your normal time.**
- C. **Read it.**  
Begin with Jeremiah 15:16—just one verse. Then move to more verses as you continue. A suggestion to begin would be to memorize the scriptures contained in this handout. Or, memorize passages you feel are speaking to you in particular at this specific stage of your life.
- D. **Pray it.**  
Make the words of this verse a prayer. Pray the ancient words that were breathed from the mouth of God Himself. Then pray them from the depths of your own soul that was bought with the blood of Jesus Christ. Join your humanity to His divinity and shake creation with the force of the eternal words.
- E. **Write it.**  
Obtain a small notebook and use it only for this daily practice. Handwrite the words to this verse in that notebook each morning after you have read and prayed it. For the purposes of this exercise, it is important to handwrite in a notebook instead of typing into an electronic diary. Date each day so you will be able to make yourself accountable and not miss a day.



**F. Say it.**

- Record this scripture on your phone in a voice memo recording app.
- Set the timer on your phone to go off 3 times per day— morning, noon, and night.
- Each time the timer alarms, listen to the scripture. Then say it once for memory, the second time as a prayer, and a third time as a promise.
- At the end of one week, you will have read the passage 7 times, handwritten the passage 7 times, listened to the passage 21 times, recited the passage 21 times, prayed the passage 21 times, and claimed the passage aloud 21 times!
- You also will have memorized the passage by this point.
- This practice will change your life. At the end of a year, you will be amazed at how much you have retained in your mind, in your heart, and in your spirit.
